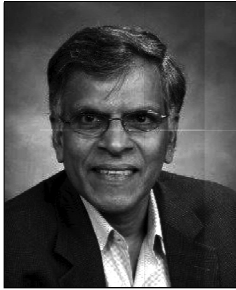


Editorial



Dear Readers of JEET

In the first 3 months of 2018, JEET has received more than 20 articles submitted for review. In most cases, the plagiarism check was conducted within 1 week, and the initial editorial check was conducted within 2 weeks of submission. Reviewer assignment took place within 3 weeks of submission, and editorial decisions within 8 weeks. With a growing number of articles submitted to the journal, 28 new reviewers were added to the review team. We are pleased to welcome Dr. Gopal Joshi and Dr. Prathiba Nagabhushan to the editorial board, and we expect to appoint a few more associate editors. With a large increase in the number of direct submissions to JEET, and additional support on the editorial board, we expect the quality and impact of the journal to increase as well. JEET already features in the top 20 Engineering Education journals in Google Scholar, and it is our goal to improve its ranking to top 10 in the next few years.

I believe JEET plays a very important role in sustaining the IUCEE ecosystem which has evolved over these years. The IUCEE ecosystem consists of a global network of experts and institutions sharing global best practices in workshops, webinars, mini-courses and conferences. Three signature programs of IUCEE are scaling up rapidly: IIEECP (IUCEE International Engineering Educator Certification Program), with assistance of IGIP (International Society for Engineering Education), Austria; IUCEE-EPICSP partnership (Engineering Projects in Community Service) in partnership with Purdue University and SCALE (Student Consortium for Advancement in Learning Engineering) which facilitates student leadership through regional, national and global events.
