Hon. Rajesh Tope, Minister for Higher & Technical Education, Govt. of Maharashtra

1. Maharashtra Govt. contemplates getting UG Technical Education under one Technical University.

Higher and technical education minister Rajesh Tope said here on Monday, “Bringing undergraduate (UG) level technical education under the proposed technological university and leaving post-graduate level technical studies under the conventional state universities, remains a serious option that is under consideration by the state government. This is essential to ensure uniformity and quality at UG level technical education.”

“Technological universities have proved to be a success in states like Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu and the same will be the case in Maharashtra,” he said, adding, “There is no opposition to the move from any quarters. “On the location of the technical university, Tope insisted that the state cabinet will soon take a final call on where to establish the university.

2. On Reforms in Higher Education

High-powered committee set up on August 25, 2010, under Former Atomic Energy Commission chairman Anil Kakodkar; Former IGNOU Vice-chancellor Ram Takwale and Former UGC chief, Arun Nigavekar, have submitted their draft reports, which are currently with the secretary to Higher and Technical Education. The Kakodkar - led panel, which will have an overarching role in the reforms process, have sought some time to fine tune the draft and present a final report, he said. "We hope the process will be completed soon." While the 11 - member Kakodkar committee, which has University of Pune vice-chancellor R. K. Shevgaonkar as its Member Secretary, was assigned to recommend steps for an overall qualitative improvement in the university education system; the Takwale committee was assigned to go into the issue of bifurcation of bigger state universities like Pune, Mumbai and Nagpur to make them more efficient. The Nigavekar committee was assigned a thorough review of the existing Acts governing higher education in the state and recommend apt amendments.
